

▼ **TRUTH OR CONSEQUENCES** Called the paradise of the southwest, this growing community offers good year round climate, mineral baths, fishing, hunting and accommodations for long or short stays . . . annual fiestas and festivals all year long. Conference and convention facilities are available for group gatherings.

▼ **WILLIAMSBURG** A village providing services to travelers on Interstate 25 or Hwy. 187. Visit art galleries and antique dealers. A community park provides basketball, tennis, picnic shelters, tables, benches and barbecues.

▼ **LAS PALOMAS** A farming community located along the Palomas Creek. Founded in the 1860s when mines boomed (and later busted), today's visitor will find artists and craftsmen in the area living side by side with farmers.

▼ **CABALLO** The home of Caballo Lake State Park located at the foot of the Caballo Mountains where visitors enjoy boating, water skiing, fishing and camping. Caballo is Spanish for horse and the mountains were named for the herds of wild horses that roamed this area.

▼ **HILLSBORO** A well-known community of retirees, artists, writers, ranchers and miners. The famed Apple Festival is held every Labor Day weekend when the sidewalks are filled with artists, merchants, vendors and hundreds of visitors. This tree-lined village has a history museum, cafes, bar, motel, bank branch, novelty shops, antique shops, art galleries, a bed and breakfast and a grocery store. A must stop-must see village on the Geronimo Trail.

▼ **KINGSTON** A small village nestled in the majestic Black Range Mountains, Kingston is home to creative residents, a historic lodge turned bed and breakfast and several craft shops. Photographers and landscape painters should plan to spend some time there. Hiking and mountain biking.

▼ **SAN LORENZO/MIMBRES** A beautiful river valley. Photographers and artists may want to capture this scenery on film and/or canvas.

▼ **WALL LAKE** Camping, fishing and picnics. A calm and refreshing area along the Geronimo Trail.

▼ **WINSTON** A community of miners, ranchers and retirees. Winston is nestled in a beautiful valley between the Cuchillo (Spanish for knife) and Negro (Black) Mountains.

▼ **CUCHILLO** A former stage stop and resting place for passengers. Apache raids were commonplace. Antique buffs should visit the store/bar/post office combination.

▼ **ELEPHANT BUTTE** A 38,000 acre lake. Year-round fishing for black and white bass, catfish, pike and crappie. Camping facilities, picnic grills, beaches, water skiing, jet skiing, sailing and golf are also available year round.
